Information according to Article 13 and 14 of the EU GDPR bout the processing of your personal data

3. Data Categories Origing and Use

Categories of processed data particularly include

- your master data (such as first name, last name, name affixes, title),
- contact data (such as your private address, address of your home institute, (mobile)phone number, email address),
- · the log data resulting from the use of IT systems,
- as well as further data related to the registration of the event (such as duration and place
 of stay, special nutrition, bank details, tax ID number, data with regard to the rules of the
 specific event),
- photo shoots and video recording during the event.

Here, special categories of personal data may also be addressed (gender, health data)

Your personal data will generally be collected from you in the course of the registration process or during the event.

Moreover, we process data permissibly acquired from publicly accessible sources (e. g. from professional networks)

4. Legal Bases and Purposes of the Data Processing

We process your personal data in compliance with the provisions of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), the new German Federal Data Protection Act (FDPA) as well as all other applicable law (e.g. BetrVG [Works Constitution Act], ArbZG [Working Hours Act], etc.).

The data processing primarily serves the execution of the event and thus the fulfilment of the contract with you. The primary legal basis for this is Art. 6 (1) (b) GDPR. Besides, special agreements according to Art. 6 (1) (a) GDPR (e. g. with video recordings) shall be deemed applicable from a data-protection perspective. As far as this is necessary we also process your

data on basis of Art 6 (1) (f) in order to preserve our or third parties' (e. g. authorities) legitimate interests. This especially applies for the investigation of crimes (legal basis § 26 (1) (2).

Due to the European anti-terror regulations 2580/2001 and 881/2002 we are obliged to compare your data with the so-called "EU terror lists", in order to guarantee that no money or other economic resources shall be provided for terrorist purposes.

There will also be a data processing for statistical purposes. Results will e.g. be a quota of women or a percentage of students. These evaluations will be passed on to e.g. grant authorities.

As far as special categories of personal data according to Art. 9 (1) GDPR will be processed this is due to the execution of the event and will be done on basis of Art. 6 (1) (b) GDPR.

In case we want to process your personal data for any purpose not mentioned above we will inform you about that in advance.

5. Data Access

Within our company only those persons and units (e. g. caterer, gate, finance, IT or personnel department, print shop) will access your personal data who need them in order to fulfill our contractual and legal duties.

Within our group we will submit your data to the GSI Helmholtzzentrum für Schwerionenforschung GmbH, as GSI GmbH centrally assumes data processing obligations (e.g. salary statements, disposal of files).

Besides, we partly use different providers for the fulfilment of our contractual and legal duties. If necessary, you may request information about the contractors and suppliers who are currently in regular business relation with us at the staff department data protection.

6. Rights of the Data Subject

Via email address betroffenenrechte@gsi.de you may demand information about the personal data stored about you. Under certain conditions you can also demand the correction or deletion of your data. Moreover, you may have the right to a limited processing of your data as well as the right to receive the data provided by you in a structured, common and machine-readable format.

7. Complaints

In case of any complaints you may contact our data protection officer specified above or a data protection supervisory authority.

8. Storage of Your Data

We will delete your personal data as soon as it no longer needed for the purposes specified above. After termination of the event your personal data will be stored as long as we are legally obliged to do so. This generally arises from legal burdens of proof and storage obligations, which are regulated, inter alia, in the German Commercial Code, the Income Tax Act, the Social Insurance Law and the Fiscal Code. Thus, the storage periods are up to ten years. Furthermore, personal data may be stored for that period of time, in which claims can be asserted against us (statutory limitation periods from three or up to thirty years).

9. Data Transmission

In case personal data will be transmitted to providers, grant authorities or group companies outside the European Economic Area (EEA) the transmission will only be done insofar the EU Commission has approved the third state's appropriate data protection level or when there are other appropriate data protection guarantees (e. g. binding intra-corporate data protection provisions or EU Standard Contractual Clauses).

You may also request information about the appropriate data protection level of our providers, grant authorities or group companies in third states from the above mentioned contact data.

10. Obligation for Data Provision

In the course of your stay, you have to provide the personal data necessary for the registration and execution of the event, for the fulfilment of the corresponding contractual duties or the collection of which we are legally obliged to. Without this data we will not be able to have you participated in the event.

11. Profiling

We partly process your data automated, aiming at the evaluation of specific personal aspects (profiling). We make use of profiling, for example, in the following case:

Due to legal and regulatory requirements we are obliged to combat money laundering, the financing of terrorism and asset-endangering criminal activities. In this context also data analyses (including payment transactions) are done. These measures also ensure your safety.

12. Right of Objection (Art. 21 GDPR)

For reasons arising from your particular situation you are at any time entitled to lodge an objection against the processing of your personal data, done on basis of Art. 6 (1) (f) GDPR (data processing on basis of a "balancing of interests"); this shall also apply to a profiling based on this provision within the meaning of Art. 4 (4) GDPR.

In case you lodge an objection, we will no longer process your personal data, unless we are able to prove compelling justifiable reasons for the processing, which outweigh your interests, rights and freedoms, or the processing serves the purpose of asserting, exercising or defending legal claims.
