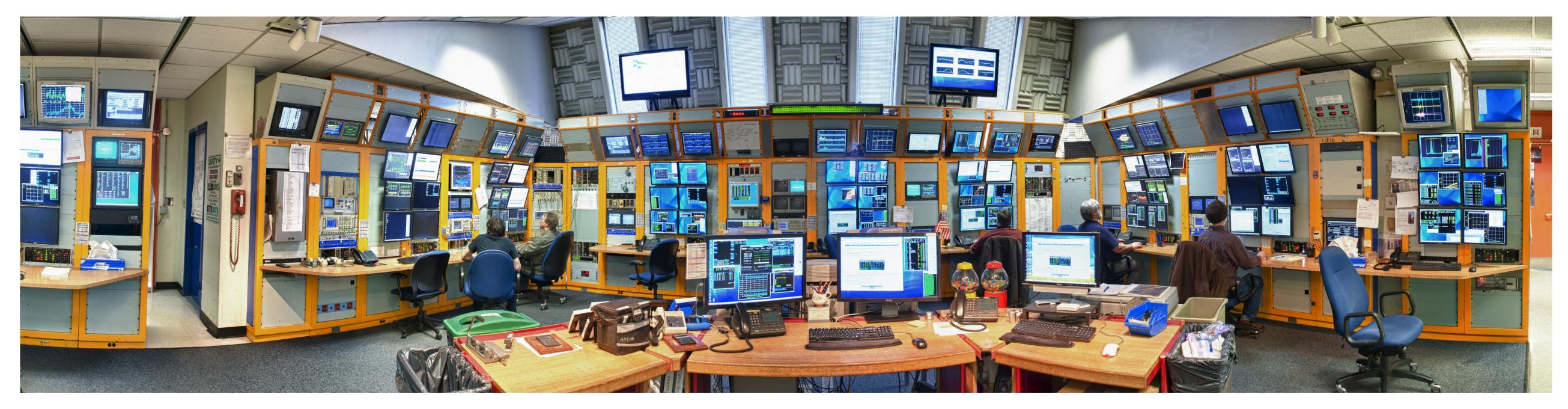
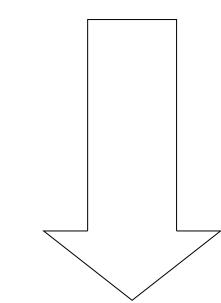
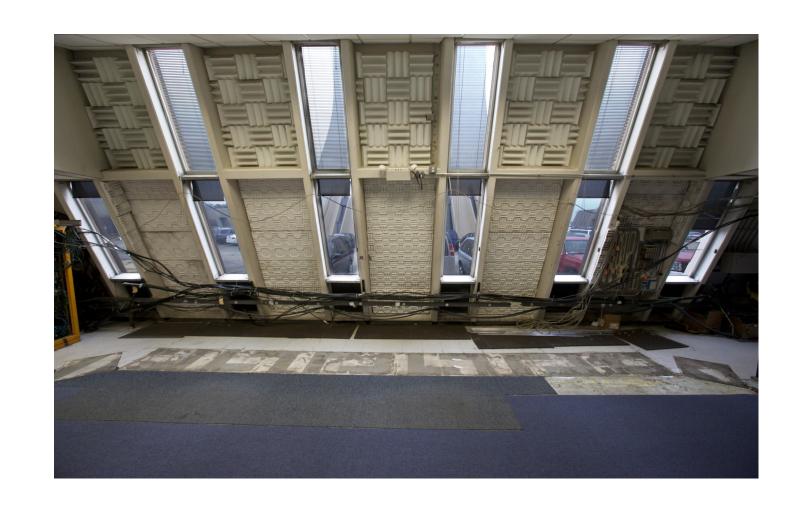
The Reconstruction of the Fermilab Accelerator Main Control Room

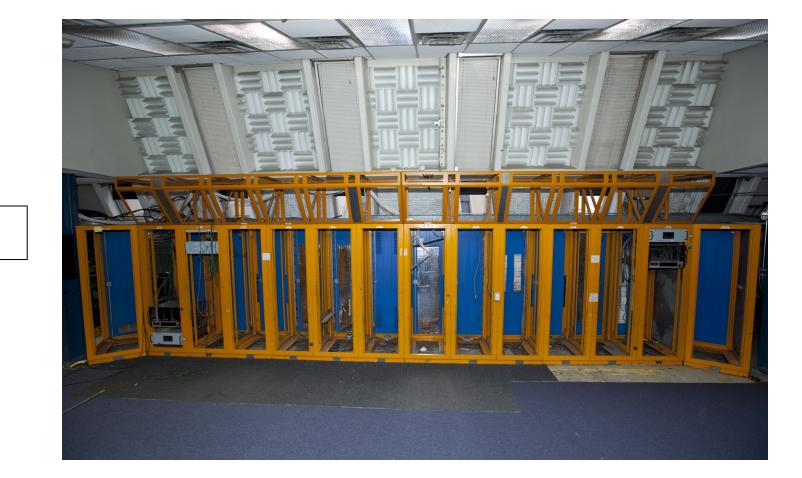
Environmental Concerns

Asbestos floor tiles removed. Different standards in 1970. New carpet, floor tiles and lighting gets installed.



Working in Stages

Even during a shutdown, devices must be monitored and access to enclosures must be maintained.



Remove Equipment

Equipment removed and **stored**. Signal cables pulled back. Electrical service disconnected.



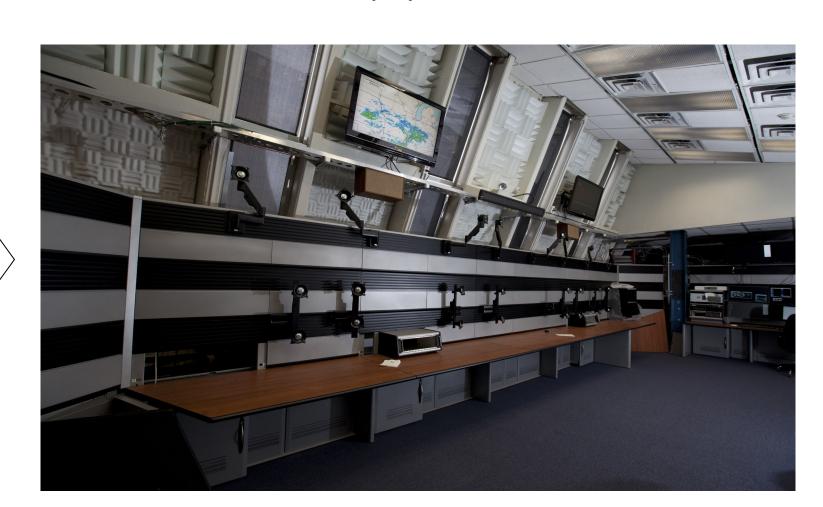
Starting Installation

Commercial hardware. Measurement to position equipment in the room is critical.



Prepping for the Installation

Inventory cable and equipment. The previous year was spent removing unused cable and equipment.



Midway into Installation

Putting back the electrical service and pulling back signal and control cables.
